RAO VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT



In 1959, then-USAF Captain Paul Ruehrmund joined the elite development team of the SAGE (Semi-Automatic

Ground Environment) computer system at MIT's Lincoln Laboratory in Boston.

Unveiled in 1956, the SAGE, AN/FSQ-7, built by IBM, Western Electric and Rand Corp., weighed 250 tons and occupied an acre of floor space, the largest computer of its time. SAGE supplied state-of-the-art air defense coverage across North America for incoming threats. According to IBM, SAGE "provided military commanders the ability to automatically calculate the most effective use of missiles and aircraft to fend off attack." It operated for 25 years until 1982.



From the 1960s to 1984, the Block House at Luke AFB housed a SAGE system under the command of the 26th North American Aerospace Defense Command NORAD) / 26th Air Defense Command (ADC).

Paul explained that SAGE was fielded by region. "Each region had duplicate computers, one active and one on standby, which ran with 20,000 vacuum tubes each, at least 60,000 tubes at each region."

"The Luke AFB SAGE center was unique," Paul said, "because it was a programming center for all the other regions and possessed more core memory... 32K total!"

SAGE in the Movies: With its panels of blinking lights, radar scopes, and switches, the SAGE computer starred in many movies as a prop, including *Planet of the Apes* (1973), *The Towering Inferno* (1974), *Spaceballs* (1987), *Independence Day* (1996) & *Lost* (2004-09).

Paul grew up on a farm in Marion, OH, where his father Edgar farmed wheat and corn, and bred dairy cows. Stella, his mother, raised 6 children. After graduating from ROTC at Capital University in Columbus, OH, Paul accepted his commission into the USAF. During his career, he worked as a weapons controller, in surveillance, and in electronic counter-countermeasures. His first assignment was to manual radar site on the Island of Sadoshima.

Vietnam Veteran; In 1969, Paul deployed to Tan Son Nhat AFB, Saigon, Vietnam, where he worked in plans and requirements. Later assignments included Little Rock AFB, where he handled maintenance on the Titan II missile program, Hancock Field, Syracuse, NY, with 21st NORAD, and North Bay, Ontario, with 22nd NORAD. In the late 1970s, Paul's final assignment involved planning and scheduling in the Block House at Luke AFB—the same time the SAGE computer

occupied the Block House.

After 21 years, Paul retired from the Air Force and then worked as a Health Dept administrator with Maricopa County Health Dept. Paul and his bride, Margaret (RIP 2020)



raised 4 children. Paul has 11 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren with #14 on the way. In May 2024, Paul joined Luke AFB RAO as a volunteer in 2021 and is a stalwart member of the Thursday AM shift. In 2024, Paul took the Arizona Honor Flight to DC. Thank you Paul for volunteering at RAO!

DON'T WAIT - GET YOUR NEXTGEN ID CARD TODAY

Starting in 2026, Legacy Uniform Services Identification cards (USID)—the blue ID card (DD Form 2 retiree)—will NO LONGER be accepted for access to benefits, privileges or DOD bases.



As a veteran, military retiree, spouse or dependent of a service member, you may be eligible for a Next Generation Uniformed Services ID card (USID). This military ID proves your identity to the DOD and gives you access to military services and programs. For details:

AIR FORCE AID SOCIETY

The Air Force Aid Society began helping the families of American Airmen when General Hap Arnold, along with his wife Bee, established a trust fund to support the children of deceased Airmen during World War II. That mission has evolved over the last 80 years, but the Society's intention remains constant. According to AFAS.org, "Today, the Air Force Aid Society's purpose is to help

Airmen, Guardians, and their families when they need us most. As the official charity of the U.S. Air Force and U.S. Space Force, AFAS provides financial assistance, educational support, community programs, and disaster relief to Air Force and Space Force families worldwide."

Financial Assistance: AFAS offers Financial Assistance when unexpected financial needs and emergencies arise. This assistance is most often given in the form of an interest-free loan to help the Service Member, Retiree, or Widows to cover unmet immediate needs.

Food Assistance: Widows will be eligible for food assistance one time following the retiree's death, with further assistance considered on a case-by-case basis; similarly, retirees may be eligible for food assistance one time after retirement and additional applications will be considered. Some assist with funeral expenses for a retiree or spouse may be considered in unique situations.

Education Support: Education Support for dependent children or surviving spouses of active and retired Airmen and Guardians is provided through grants, loans, and scholarships. The General Henry H. Arnold Education Grant application is the starting point for the Arnold Grant, the AFAS Merit and Grit Scholarships, and the AFAS Supplemental Education Loan Program.

HEALTHY LIVING: WATCH OUT FOR THESE CRITTERS IN THE DESERT

Arizona hosts part of all four of the major deserts in the United States: The Sonoran, Mojave, Chihuahua, and Great Basin. These deserts hold challenges and dangers, to include venomous snakes and black widow spiders.

Snakes: Of the 36 rattlesnake species found throughout the United States, 13 of them live in Arizona. They are often spotted around Camelback Mountain, South Mountain, desert areas, and other similar regions in the Without highly the effective antivenom, Mojave rattlesnakes could easily top the list of the most dangerous animals in Arizona, as well as Mexico, Utah, and Nevada. Green to olive green scales with a brown or tan diamond pattern that runs down its back, is how the Nevada Department of Wildlife describes Mojave rattlesnakes. They are considered one of the more aggressive rattlesnakes, as they are highly defensive if they feel threatened. If you hear the classic buzzing sound of a rattlesnake, back away!



Rx: A bite can include pain, swelling, bruising, and bleeding. Their venom can also make the blood in the circulatory system harder to clot. If bitten do not tie a tourniquet, do not apply ice and do not attempt to suck the

venom; go directly to the emergency department regardless of your age, gender and level of health. Although the anti-venom is highly effective, you need to stay a night or two in the hospital because the venom can damage the tissue in the area of the bite. Wearing boots, long pants, and using a flashlight at night is key to being prepared. Also avoid placing hands and feet in hidden areas.

Black Widow Spider: Considered the most venomous spider in North America, the Black Widow Spider (especially the female) is one you hope doesn't crawl your way. Beware since these spiders are sometimes found in dark corners of homes and in basements. Even though the Black Widow Spider's venom is thought to be 15 times stronger than rattlesnake venom, their bites are usually not fatal.

Rx: If bitten, cleanse the wound with soap and water, apply ice, elevate the area and



take over-the-counter medication to ease pain. If symptoms worsen, visit the ER. Elderly people, those with compromised immune systems and young children are most susceptible to severe symptoms such as nausea, weakness, fever, difficulty breathing and elevated blood pressure. In these cases, patients should seek medical attention immediately. Even so, keep an eye out for spiders with a red or yellow hourglass mark on their bellies, often hanging out in dark crevices and secluded corners of the house or basement.

Enjoy the breathtaking beauty of Arizona, but stay on the lookout for those creatures who may not be as friendly as we are; whether it runs, slithers, hops, crawls or flies!

Buddy Plan: Don't forget to carry a charged phone, a first aid kit and use the buddy system. Everyone likes alone time while they're enjoying nature, but taking a buddy along can save your life.


